WHAT DOES A CATHOLIC CHARISMATIC LOOK LIKE -WOULD YOU RECOGNIZE ONE?

The impact of Pentecost in the lives of early Christians was:

- They praised the Lord through the Holy Spirit which had revealed the greatness of God to them.
- They announced the Gospel with conviction.
- The Lord confirmed the proclamation of the Gospel with signs.
- Their life had become a light for others.
- They loved each other and they shared their belongings.

What characterizes a Catholic Charismatic?

The Baptism of the Holy Spirit, a personal experience of the Holy Spirit living and working in us. *Praise:* The one who encounters the Risen and

living Jesus is filled with joy and praise.

Conversion and the journey towards holiness:

These steps of conversion are followed by a commitment to seek the glory of God in all things.

Brotherly love: Charismatics give their time and money to help others.

Evangelization: the fire of the Spirit which burns in them, impels Charismatics to proclaim the Good News everywhere: in markets, streets, at home, in prisons, and in the workplace.

The Charismatic has a constant concern for his formation—to get to know Christ and the Church better. This is why he takes part in retreats, conferences and formation sessions.

The commitment to serve the Church: those who have had this experience of the Renewal commit to serving others in the Church: catechesis, assistance to the sick, guiding children, etc.

To this end, there is to be also noted a good collaboration with the pastors of the Church.



WHY SHOULD WE SING?

Sing to the LORD a new song. (Psalm 98:1)

Why should we sing? Because singing engages our hearts as well as our minds, and God cares about the whole person, emotions included. wants to breathe life into our spirits and minds and bodies. Singing offers him entry into our whole being in a way that ordinary speech doesn't. And if we have difficulty opening our hearts, singing can open the pathway for his Spirit to move in

So sing! Sing of Jesus' victory on the cross, his victory over sin. Sing because God has given victory through you Corinthians Christ (1 15:57). Sing because you do not have to live mired in guilt and shame. Sing because you have access to the Father through the blood of Jesus' cross.

Sing joyfully as you

see his kindness and

faithfulness toward

you.

Sing because he who is faithful will cleanse you in the pure water of life. These aren't things we just hope will happen; they are steadfast promises of God!

Yes, sing a new song to the Lord! Sing of God's justice, revealed in his unfathomable mercy and kindness toward us. Sing of his dedication to his plan and his will that no one will perish but that all people will "be saved" and "come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:4). Sing because he has redeemed you from sin - yes, even the sin you brought upon yourself. Sing because he wants to make holy and blameless - and because he is faithful and will accomplish it!

Sing because God wants to make you holy and blameless in his sight and in the sight of all those around you. Sing a song of gratitude as he leads you in paths of righteousness today. Sing as he cleanses your conscience and gives you rest. Sing of what is pure and right, lovely and good. Sing joyfully as you see his kindness and faithfulness toward you. Sing of your longing to know all of this more, to experience his love and mercy more and more deeply. Sing the new song that all the saints and angels are singing in heaven right now: "God is good! He marvelous has done things!"

She earned a licentiate at the International Theological Institute in Gaming, Austria, completed her doctorate in biblical theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. She is the author of Men And Women Are From Eden: A Study Guide to John Paul II's Theology of the Body and co-editor of three books on biblical interpretation. In 2014

CAN YOU KEEP A SECRET?

There is a saying I heard "I can keep a secret but I cannot vouch for someone to whom I tell it."

I have also heard some say that one of the best kept secrets in the Church is that there is a Catholic Charismatic prayer meeting every week.

When we first came into the Renewal, many moons ago, we did not know that there were prayer meetings and "Life in the Spirit Seminars" taking place and we would have loved to have participated much earlier than we did. Would there be evidence that some of us have kept the "Fire" to ourselves? I heard one story of a person who was critically ill lacking a faith in Christ, telling a friend "If you really were my friend, you would have shared about Jesus with me before this."

One icebreaker to share our faith is to befriend people, talk about family, occupation, recreation, share faith stories (what God has done for you, experiences of God in your life), ask them to share any of their faith stories. Ask them if they would like to be closer to Jesus and invite them to attend a Holy Spirit Seminar or spiritual event or a prayer meeting with you. And don't be anxious about it, the Holy Spirit will guide you all the way, especially if you give Him permission.
